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NOTE REGARDING ENTHALPY

Enthalpy is the term now approved by the American Society of Mechanical Engineers to replace the old term heat content or total heat. By definition, the enthalpy of any fluid in any state is the sum of its internal energy and its pressure-volume product.

The zero of enthalpy is arbitrarily chosen; for water, it is selected as saturated liquid at 32F;
